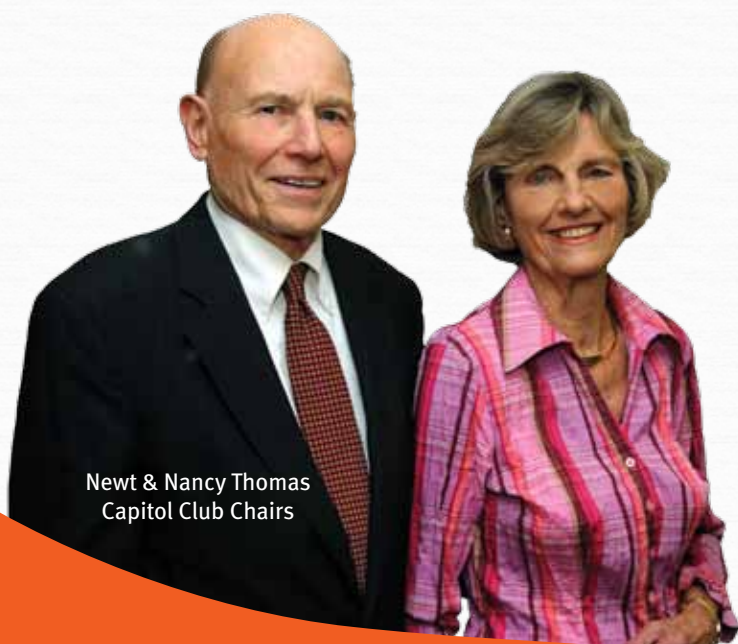

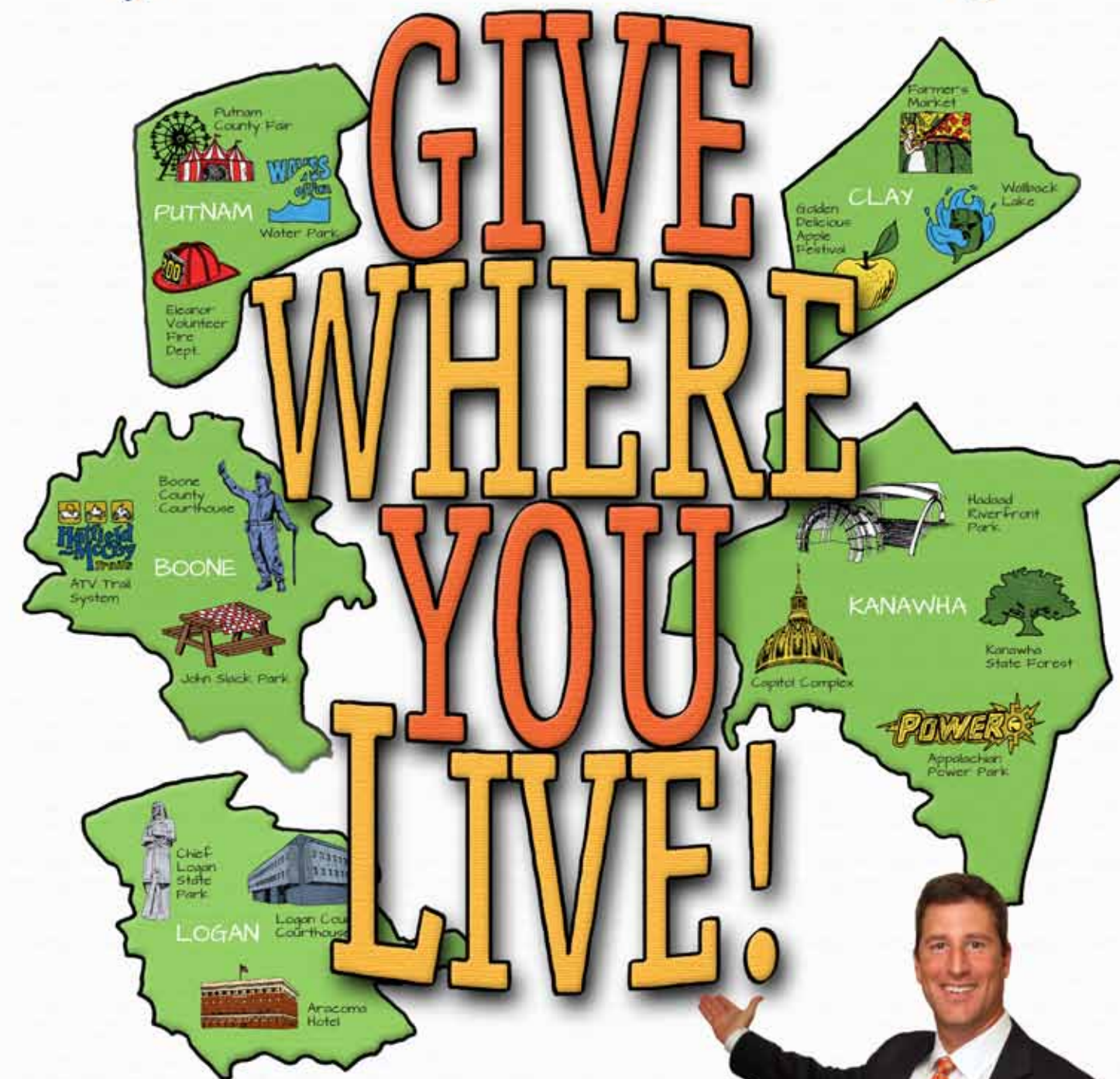

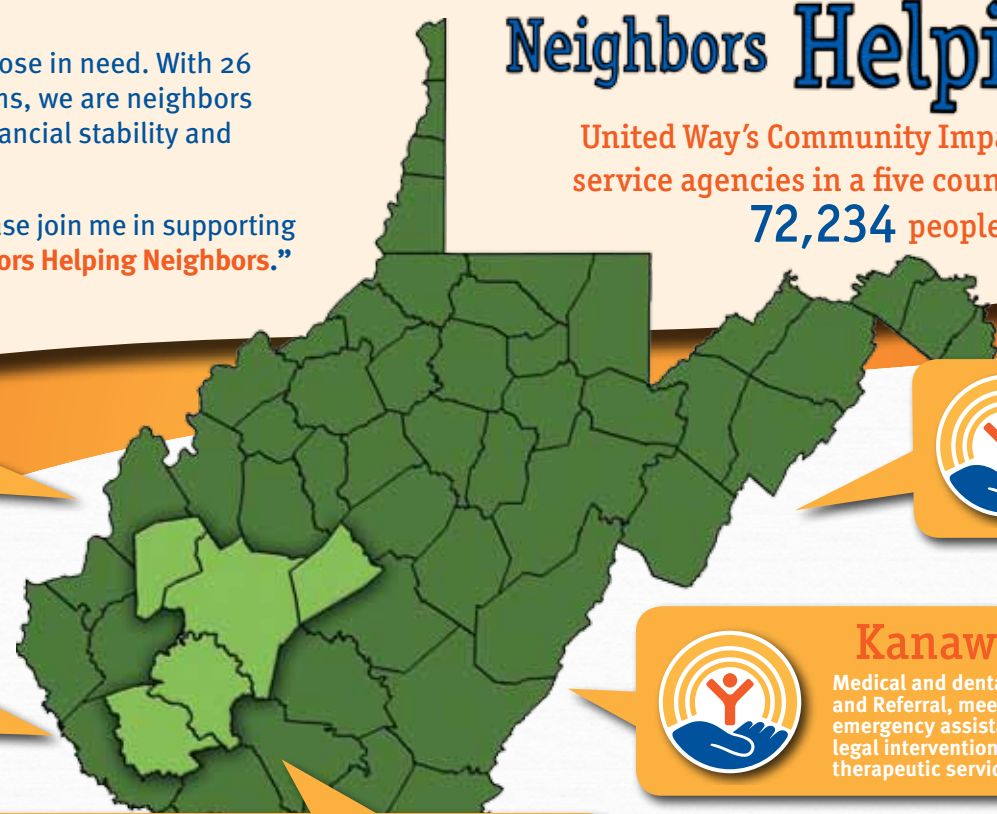

Logan County
Counseling, medical and dental assistance, Information and Referral, safety education and shelter.

Kanawha County
Medical and dental assistance, Information and Referral, meeting basic needs, counseling, emergency assistance, youth development, legal intervention, residential treatment, and therapeutic services for children.

Boone County
Emergency assistance and shelter, Information and Referral, meeting basic needs, medical and dental assistance, counseling, legal intervention, and advocacy for youth and adults.
